Participants will learn how public value is created, how to gain democratic legitimacy and support, and ways to gather capacity to implement.

Australia. She is also Deputy Chancellor of Monash University, Chair of Good Shepherd Microfinance and Chair of Monash College Pty Ltd. As former Chair of the Victorian Bushfire Reconstruction and Recovery Authority, from February 2009 to September 2010, Christine Nixon oversaw the largest recovery and rebuilding operation Victoria has ever undertaken. From September 2010 to July 2011, Ms Nixon was the Victorian Government's Volunteer Advisor on Bushfire Reconstruction and Recovery. Christine continues to support affected communities, and worked with the bereaved community she remains a member of the Victorian Bushfire Appeal Fund panel. Prior to joining the Authority, Christine was the 19th Chief Commissioner of Victoria Police leading 14,000 staff, operating across more than 500 locations and overseeing an annual budget of \$1.7 billion. She joined

Victoria Police in April 2001, after serving with the New South Wales Police from 1972 and attaining the rank of Assistant Commissioner.
